Introduction – Kim Street

- Current Chair St. Martha School Advisory Society
 - Raised more than \$1.2M for Playground Upgrade, raised total of over \$2M for other projects.
- Past-Chair Elmwood Elementary School Council
 - Raised more than \$1.4M for new playground, spray park, skating rink other initiatives raised over \$2M (nature scape, gym equipment, computers)
- Married 15 years and Mom of three young boys including one with severe physical and mental challenges
- Over 25 years involved with non-profit and charitable organizations
- Over 10 years directly employed as fund development/volunteer manager
 of a number of local and national charitable organizations

Fundraising Realities

- Limited direct funding what options are available
- Everyone fighting for same dollar
- Groups get burnt out doing bake sales and raffles
- Need to access available government and private funding sources school boards and communities leagues have limited financial resources

Why are we here today?

- Share ideas and experiences
- Source, utilize public and private grants don't be afraid to ask for money (and big money!)
- Costs of programs and capital works are high, everyday fundraisers don't cut it any more – access to greater funds required

- Information Package
- Including samples of:
 - Business Plan
 - Needs Assessment
 - Donation request letter

Strategy

- Develop goals, timelines and budgets
- Be clear and concise
- Be conscious of moving parts
- Understand and be prepared for required commitment

Team

- The key to successful fundraising programs lies in the development of a strong team
- Establish parent and caregiver support and engagement
- Establish and maintain support from school administration
- Develop diverse team (i.e. range of skills, abilities, time commitments, experience, etc.)
- Sometimes projects take years to bring to life so keep in mind people come and go; maintain continuity.
- Promote communication
- Plan to work hard, plan to play hard!
- Depending on the size of your goals, work hard but always keep your eye on the target and the rewards of reaching the target

Planning

- Understand and define needs
- Develop supporting information
 - Business Plan/Case
 - Financial Summaries
 - Financial Plan cost estimates and quotations
 - Needs Assessment
 - Letters of Support (School Board, MP, MLA, community, etc.)
- Create generic package to use as base for all applications cater as required

Opportunities

- Review criteria, areas of support; understand the funding opportunity
- Understand timelines for submission, award and execution of grants
- Grants available through municipal, provincial and federal governments
- Grants available through various corporations and corporate foundations
- Grants available through non-profit/charitable organizations
- Leverage grants with one another
- Be aware of matching grants

- Example 1: Community Facilities Enhancement Program (CFEP)
 - Capital works funding including playgrounds and construction, renovation or redevelopment of community public-use facilities
 - Applications accepted quarterly
 - Funding up to \$125,000 matching funds
 - Needs business case
 - Get support of local MLA
 - Can only apply once per fiscal year. Can apply for CIP only if CIP is for operations not capital. Can't have two capital grants open simultaneously.
 - Can not make application with existing open grant
 - If project has multiple phases, can apply multiple times

- Example 2: S'Cool Life Fund
 - Used to enhance the arts
 - For programs for children K-12
 - Includes dance programs, art, music
 - Up to \$3,000
 - Applications completed online
 - Due in September, response in approximately 6 months

- Community Initiatives Program (CIP) Alberta (\$75,000 per fiscal year)
- Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund (CIIF) Canada Currently closed awaiting new program (\$250,000)
- Alberta Tire Recycling Program Alberta (\$30,000)
- Neighborhood Park Development Program (NPDP) Edmonton (up to \$250,000)
- Roots for Trees Edmonton (\$20,000)
- Community Investment Fund Calgary
- The Calgary Foundation Calgary
- Calgary Board of Education Calgary

Grant Applications

- Keys to applying for grants:
 - Know your audience
 - Investigate
 - Review application guidelines and criteria
 - Complete all requirements
- After grant is submitted:
 - Follow up on unsuccessful applications; learn from any shortcomings
 - Follow through on successful applications
 - Set the stage for future applications

Summary

Key Points:

- Plan
- Develop a strong, diverse team
- Be clear in your goals
- Identify potential funding sources
- Understand the requirements of the funding agency
- Meet all requirements of grant applications
- Follow up on declined applications
- Follow through with approved applications
- Most importantly, don't get discouraged!

PROJECT INFORMATION

Introduction

Name of School is proposing to redevelop its playground, add a shade area with picnic tables and renovate the basketball courts (add own information). These facilities are located in Park Name alongside of School Name and address. The current play area at the park is in the same location for the new proposed play area as this area is nestled in a sage place with good sight lines.

(Community League add own information) is a matured community with the majority of the homes dating back to the early 1980's. The park play area was first constructed in 1997, and since then the play area has remained the same. Community area is a quiet community that is affordable and easy access to all parts of the city with available transit to access all areas throughout the city of Edmonton.



The Redevelopment Committee recognizes this trend and wants to continue to encourage young families into the area and all the amenities that Name of Community League has to offer. Through the revitalization Playground Name play area has been identified as a need to modernize or come with the times and create a new play area that will last for the next 20-30 years to come for families and seniors to enjoy with their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

The planning committee will be taking into consideration all users of the park and their individual needs in making an enjoyable experience for all.

The project will include such items as: (use information from Survey)

- Innovative play structure
- Benches, tables and receptacle cans
- Sheltered areas for seniors and small children
- Good sight lines for security and protection
- A combination of sand and rubber flooring for accessibility
- Renovating the existing basketball Courts

The play area will be developed in cooperation with the City of Edmonton Community Services Department. The new play area will adhere to Canadian Safety Standards and will be signed over to the City of Edmonton once the project is complete. Community Services will then be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the



equipment. PROJECT

PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS/DETAILS

It has been determined from a needs assessment conducted in date that the following amenities should be considered in the design of the play area.

- Equipment must meet the needs and demands of children ages infant to youth (especially children who are older than Grade 4).
- Extra picnic tables, benches and garbage receptacles are required
- Extra lighting will be required
- A roofed gazebo is needed for shade and board games to be played under on hot summer days

It is desired that the play area be progressive by age with both children and youth equipment on site. There will be a section developed for toddlers, moving into 5-12 years of age and then youth area.

The toddler area will incorporate age appropriate equipment with a theme yet to be determined (i.e. trains, pirate ships, etc.). This area will also include a toddler size picnic table to be located near the toddler play area.

We see this project as an opportunity to revitalize this community and encourage community involvement.

A preliminary list of equipment to be incorporated into the upgraded park includes but is not limited to the following:

- spinning nets
- Swings
- Slides
- Climbers
- Monkey bars
- Bridges
- Activity Boards



The equipment picked for the playground will be finalized through consultation with children, residents and other stakeholders in the community and then presented to community members for final approval.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

Name of School began researching the need to redevelop the play area in the date. When the current committee was formed, a needs assessment survey was distributed through the community through the community newsletter to over number homes. In addition, over number surveys were handed out to the parents of Name of School. The response was overwhelmingly positive with over % response rate. The committee continues to encourage input from the community through the School newsletter and is always looking for more volunteers to join the project.

Attached in Appendix B are examples of the surveys and the results. It is the belief of the committee that all needs and interests from the community have been expressed through the needs assessment surveys that have been completed including mail drops, newsletter and Westend Community News, talking to the schools and interviews. The Schools Name Redevelopment Committee is satisfied with the work to date and believes that more volunteers will join the team closer to finalization of construction.



The School Name Redevelopment Committee is committed to the Community of name but also to the City of Edmonton and its vast inventory of parkland space, playgrounds, basketball courts and shaded area. The redevelopment of name of playground

area adds to the City's inventory of exceptional playground space for children and families to enjoy.

Name of School Redevelopment Committee is honoured to be a part of this tradition and would like that all visitors who pass by the park with car, bike, roller blade or walking, stop by and enjoy the park. The park will be open during regular City Parkland hours and easily accessible by walking paths and a bike path that goes through the park. All ages and abilities will be able to enjoy the park and it is our hope that the Province of Alberta comes on board and supports this Community Development project as well.

Dear Donations Dude:

We are writing to you with regards to the Name School. Our school is located in west Edmonton near West Edmonton Mall and Misercordia Hospital and offers the Science Program, the Individual Support Program and the Early Education Program to children in the community and from around the city. In addition, the school is supported by the School Council which is undertaking initiatives to provide additional funds and resources to the school which it is not able to attain through public funding.

At the present time School Name is having a hard time establishing a fundraising program as many of our families have challenges in their daily lives that limit the resources available to us. It is really hard for the families to take on a fundraising role when they have other challenges in their lives. This neighbourhood is a lower income area and families are just unable to help us with fundraising.

We would like to request funding from the Company Name. Currently our school is in its original state and needs some much needed renovations. As you probably know from the media, the Edmonton Catholic School Board has really limited our budgets and it has become more stressful than in previous years.

Our School Administration have a strong philosophy regarding literacy will allocated available resources to achieve this objective. As you know, if our students do not have the ability to read, they will struggle throughout their entire education and in life. For this we need to make sure that the books are exciting and the area is inviting so it is fun and enjoyable and does not feel like work. With that said, we need to overhaul our library as it is very out dated. We would like to replace our old shelving units with new accessible shelves (as we have a huge amount of children with disabilities), leather couches (due to allergies) as well as furniture that is the size of our little ones. The Early Education Program within Name of School has children ages 2 ½ - 5 years old with one or more disability (that could be a delay in speech or a disability of some sort). This would allow our smaller children to access this area and feel that it is at their level and not just for the bigger kids.

We would like to ask Company Name to donate \$10,000 towards this renovation. This would be a huge donation for us and would allow us to take our library to the next level.
